TV is going digital all over the UK and soon the traditional TV signal will be switched off in your area. If you don't have digital TV by the time of switchover, your TV screen will go blank. But you don't need to worry; the Help Scheme is here to help.

What does the Help Scheme do?

We have helped hundreds of thousands of people switch to digital. If you're eligible, we can arrange for an approved installer to supply and install everything you need to switch one of your TV sets to digital. We will tell you about all the options available to you and make sure that you are happy with how it works. We'll make it easy for you to go digital and you won't even have to change your TV set.

How do I know if I have digital TV?

If you get more than five channels on one of your TVs, you probably already have digital TV. However, even if you already have digital TV on your main set, we can still convert another TV in your home, for example in your bedroom or kitchen.

Am I eligible?

We can help everyone who:

- Is aged 75 or over, **or**
- Has lived in a care home for six months or more, **or**
- Gets (or could get):
 - Disability Living Allowance (DLA), **or**
 - Attendance or Constant Attendance Allowance, **or**
 - Mobility supplement, **or**
- Is registered blind or partially sighted.

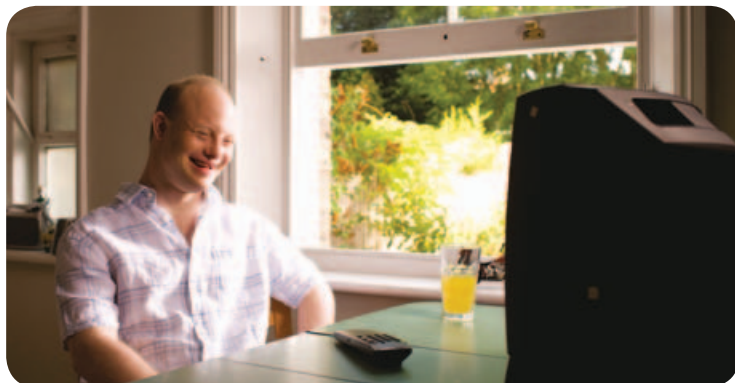
Will I have to pay?

We'll ask you to pay **£40** all-inclusive for the standard option. This includes:

- Easy-to-use equipment.
- An approved installer to supply and install the equipment for you.
- A 12 month aftercare service including a free helpline.

This service is **free** if you are eligible and also get pension credit, income support, income-related employment and support allowance or income-based jobseeker's allowance. There are other options available at an extra cost, which we can explain to you.

You must have a valid TV licence (free if you are over 75) to get help.
